Challenges & Limitations

- This study is explanatory rather than confirmatory, and aims to inform future efforts
 - Correlation of exam performance with clinical skill remains undersupported
 - Basic Exam usage varied greatly among residency programs

In January 2025, the ABA will remove most policy mandates to the Basic Exam, including those related to training extension and graduation
